



I would like to welcome and congratulate our new Committee members, Alen Garrett as Rear Commodore, and Peter Gratton as Safety Officer. We are certain they will contribute well to the activities of the club. I would also like to thank the retiring Committee Members, Pauline Draper and Ray Frith for their input while serving on Committee. Of course I also welcome back Committee members who have chosen to continue in their various roles and thank them for their commitment to the Squadron.

It is with great sadness that I have to report that we lost a member at sea this year. Many will have known Nick Smith. Our hearts go out to his wife Fiona, his two children and his family. Many members have passed on their best wishes and have tried to be of some comfort to the family during this difficult time. The water police, coast guard and many volunteers responded with a huge search and we thank them for their efforts. I would urge all boating members to please think about safety for themselves and passengers when going out on the water, you cannot be too careful when out in the elements. It is also very important to let someone know when you are heading out on the water and when you expect to return.

This year's Annual General Meeting was held on Saturday the 10th of October. It was very well attended with over 100 members and guests. Once the business of the AGM was concluded we made time to have an open forum for half an hour or so, where members could bring up items for discussion, which was well received. We then finished the day by inviting members who attended to stay on for some refreshments and food and some good fellowship.

As I write this article the next items on the agenda are our Working Bee and Opening Day. By the time you read this both events will have taken place. Steve Walker, CEO Yachting Victoria, was our special guest for this year's Opening Day and his role was to officially open the season.

Two awards are given to members every year, and these were awarded at our Opening Day Celebration.

The "Furphy Award" - This award is handed out to a member who we believe has contributed significantly to our Quarterly Magazine. Jeff Shawcroft wrote a wonderful story

which he shared with us about his journey and adventures sailing his new boat back from the USA. Well done Jeff.

The "Allen Lapin Award" - This award is given to a member of the club who offers service above and beyond the call of duty. Glen Botterill was nominated for this award. He often helps members with all sort of boat problems, and in many cases he assists members whilst putting aside his own work. This dedication is appreciated and this award acknowledges Glen's commitment to assisting the club and it's members.

Continuing on from last months issue, i.e. understanding the Newhaven Yacht Squadron's Rules, I have taken the following extract:

Boat Register and identification (item 20)

All boats other than rowing dinghies and tenders owned by members of the Squadron, shall be entered into The Squadron's Register established and maintained by the Secretary. Each boat will be allocated a Squadron number prefixed by the numbers 'NYS'

Each boat will carry near or on the transom its name, The Squadron prefix and number in letters not less than 50mm in height, boats liable for government registration must also carry the official registration plate and number as required by the State Motor Boat Act 1961, as amended.

All sailing yachts will carry on the main sail and on or near the transom, identification as required by the AYF/ IYRU rules 1981-1985 and as amended from time to time.

Acquisition or disposal of a boat entered on the Squadron Register must be notified to the Secretary in writing within seven (7) days of such transaction.

The Committee has the power to refuse registration of any boat, which it considers to be unsuitable for the Squadron, or which it regards as being unseaworthy. The Committee, at its discretion, may remove from the Squadron's Register any boat and order its removal from The Squadron's premises at the Members expense.

Every member who owns or uses a boat shall comply with the Squadron's safety rules and prescriptions as determined by the Committee.

Once again I would like to wish all members a happy and safe boating season and I urge all members to get involved in the club's activities and make the best of being a part of our excellent club







Rules for the **Newhaven Yacht Squadron** Year-round Fishing Competition

The competition will start at 0800hrs on the day after Presentation Night (10 May 2015) and finish at 1500hrs on Presentation Night 2016.

All fish sizes must comply with the Victorian Recreational Fishing Guide 2013 or as amended.

All fish must be free from mud, sand, sinkers or weights and must be weighed on the official squadron scales located in the lower deck. Fish must be weighed in the "as caught" condition except gummy sharks which must be bled and gutted.

The fishing area is unlimited, however fish must be weighed within 24 hours of being caught.

All fish weighed-in must be recorded in the logbook and witnessed by another member of the Newhaven Yacht Squadron.

Entry is free.

There is no limit to the number of species of fish that the competitor may weigh-in. Please enter fish and weight as a record even if it is not the heaviest already weighed.

Prizes will be awarded for the heaviest fish for the year in the following categories.

Australian Salmon Snapper Flathead Trevally

Gummy/school shark Heaviest Fish Overall King George Whiting (excluding sharks, wrasse,

Pike/Snook elephant fish)
