

Kon is heading overseas for a well-earned holiday, visiting his country of birth. We wish Kon well with his new found freedom and he will now have more time to enjoy his new boat. We have advertised for the position of Social Secretrary and by the time this magazine goes out we may have filled it, however if you are interested and the position is still available please let us know. We also welcome Tom Rawlings to the Committee as our replacement Other Member; Tom volunteered his services and was unanimously accepted by the Committee. We wish Tom well in his position and we are certain he will be a great asset to the Committee and the club.

Social Secretary: Due to the resignation of Kon Cili, this position is currently open at the time of writing

If you have an interest in coming on board as a Committee member you can get a nomination form from the Secretary (David Tonkin) and you must have been a member for at least two years to qualify. Your nomination must also have a Proposer and a Seconder from senior members.

Youth Plan

The Futures Discussion has highlighted the obvious need to develop a Youth Plan for NYS. Have we drifted too far from our foundation as a family club, encouraging participation in safe boating?. The Sailing Sub-Committee, along with the Motorboat and Angling Sub-Committee have been tasked with developing this plan. We would welcome younger members to these committees; some of us have been on these committees for over 30 years. So younger means; less than 60, 70 or

We envisage working cooperatively with our neighbouring clubs and can learn from their progress in this area. I hope our program will be complementary to what these clubs are developing. An essential requirement is the accredited training of members to coach, train and keep-safe young boaties. Gavin Russell, as one of our Sailability volunteers, has recently completed an Assistant Sail Training Certificate course. See his report in this Quarterly. This is an obvious area where we can work cooperatively with our neighbours.

In developing our Sailability Program we have seen that an extension will be to other young people in our area. Additionally the Dinghy Racks and associated emphasis on dinghy sailing will naturally add to our endeavours and will form part of our Youth Plan. We have found that young people enjoy fishing and this too can fit into our plan. We are considering offering our Sailability Program to local schools. To use a worn out slogan; "We Live In Exciting Times".

Marie and Neil Lacco have exemplified the values we treasure at Newhaven Yacht Squadron. They have contributed to a broad range of activities with their family. Their children and grandchildren are active boaties at our club. On a personal note; many years ago our two youngest children enjoyed competing in a Club Regatta in a Fairy Penguin dinghy built and maintained by Neil so that he could encourage kids to go sailing.

We have lost an accomplished story teller but surely this is not the end of an era. NYS will continue to encourage families to participate in the wide range of activities centred on boating in this wonderful environment. We must make sure we encourage and support young people in enjoying what we have discovered.

Sailability Dinghy Storage Shed; to go to the AGM

Guided by positive feedback from discussion at the 2015 AGM we have worked hard in developing the NYS Sailability Program. We have achieved four levels of state and local government plans and permissions to succeed in getting permission to build our shed. The July meeting of the Bass Coast Shire Council unanimously agreed to our proposal. Thanks to the untiring work of George Reek, attached are the plans (see opposite page) submitted to BCSC. The shed is to be built on the land east of our maintenance yard and will provide lockup storage for the Sailability dinghies with some space for members' dinghies. Additionally there will be space to develop a workshop for the use of members. The Shire will require us to incorporate this land into our lease; explaining that this will be seen as a community based activity. In the mean time we will pay a licence to occupy the land.

The proposal is for NYS to pay for the construction of the shed and the Sailability Dinghies will be purchased from donations, grants and sponsorship. Stan Jackson has been successful in obtaining a grant to purchase our first Hansa Dinghy. See Stan's report and view this video showing the Hansa dinghy that we will be purchasing;

The Committee is considering three quotes for a constructed shed and other quotes to supply only. Constructing the shed ourselves would be a great community effort but could only proceed if a member, with building experience, was able to commit to managing this project. Our preference is to have the shed constructed, as there will be a large amount of work in fitting it out with dinghy racks and shelving.


We are set to go once the AGM this October gives us approval to fund the project. It is wise for us to go to the members as this is a large financial obligation and should only proceed with the support and commitment of members to further developing our Sailability **Program**. 


We can learn a lot from this video.



Changes to By-Laws 4.2 and 4.3

The change to these By-Laws has received much consideration over the last 3 meetings and they now revert back to the wording that was originally in place for many years before the change. It was determined that By-Law 4.2 and By-Law 4.3 be amended as follows:

- (a) In By-Law 4.2, where the words 'At the date of printing the fee is \$1,100, GST inc.', appear, and in By-Law 4.3, where the words 'At the date of printing this fee is \$1,100, GST inc.', appear, they be replaced with the words; 'At the date of printing the fee shall be one fifth of the current value of the licence', or
- (b) pay the difference between the current value of the licence and the value which would in the ordinary course of business be returned to the berth holder on surrender of the licence thereby creating a new lease.

And that a new By-Law 4.3.1 be inserted as follows:

The one fifth option contained in By-Law 4.2 and 4.3 above, may only be exercised once for each and every berth.

As I stated in the previous magazine, we had submitted an application in the latest round of the VicHealth Active Club Grants program to purchase a Hansa dinghy and its associated accessories.

Well, I am now very pleased to report that our application was successful, and we have received \$10,300.to purchase a Hansa 303 Wide dinghy. This Hansa is a 2 seater dinghy that can be sailed with either 1 or 2 crew, has a mainsail and Jib, is easy to rig and launch, is stable, and can't sink. We will take delivery of the dinghy later this year. We are quite excited about acquiring one of these unique little craft, which has been designed for people with disabilities in mind. It will enable us to start a program that will give our participants a true and challenging sailing experience. It will also be well-suited and available to beginner sailors. I have even heard some of the 'old salts' around the club say they are keen to have a go in one!

NYS Future Planning Progress Report

THANK YOU TO ALL THOSE who involved themselves in ▲ the process of planning for the future of the Newhaven Yacht Squadron. We had 44 respondents to our online survey, and 43 members participate in our planning forum on Sunday, June 5. Analysis of the data from the process has highlighted some issues of which the Committee was aware and are acting upon, as well as depicting new information and challenges. The forum proved to be a very successful event, with all participants making positive and constructive contributions to help guide the present and future committees to improve the facilities and services provided for members. Many thanks to Stacey Daniel for the great job she did in facilitating the forum.

During the afternoon, Stacey sought participants' responses to the following questions:

- What in regard to the club is the most important to you?
- What in regard to the club do you think is the most important to others?
- What is the club's main strength?
- What is the club's main weakness?
- What is the club's major threat?
- What are the club's immediate, short term and longer term priorities?

The online survey asked people to respond to the following:


- What club facilities do you use?
- What activities do you take part in?
- What would you like to see happening at NYS in the short and long term?
- What are the challenges for NYS?

The following is a precis of the information gained:

- * It was warming to find that by far the most valued facet of our club is the friendly-supportive-family-community feeling that exists; and that this characteristic also rated highly as a strength of the club.
- * It is important for members to be able to participate in a number/variety of social activities; and social activities are the most activities participated in.
- * The clubhouse was also rated of high importance; and is the second most used facility. Some members suggested there was a need to start planning for a refurbishment downstairs. The forthcoming lease renewal in 2018 was also raised. The Committee has formed a working party to plan to prepare for this.

- * The marina/boat ramp was regarded as very important and was the most used facility. A lack of berths was seen as a weakness, and a marina extension was the highest scoring priority/'want to see' issue. Using sheet piling to transform a part of the rock wall along the road into small-boat berths was regarded as a worthy project to explore. The Committee has started to form a working party to study the merit of this venture. Expanding the marina footprint proved to be a high priority and 'like to see'. The Committee acknowledges and accepts that this is a genuine matter that should be looked into, but has decided not to act on this until after the lease renewal process has been completed. The need to de-silt the marina was seen as a weakness and a threat, and was rated as a high priority to address. The Committee has been acting on this concern over the past year, and a hydrographic survey of the marina to provide information for future action took place in mid-July. A pontoon to the north-west of the boatyard was a 'like to see soon', but not regarded as of high importance. The Committee is also exploring the feasibility of constructing this.
- * There was a desire expressed for more dinghy storage, and to implement more sailing activities; and our Sailability program was seen to be expanding in the future. Approvals and plans have been acquired to construct a Sailability/dinghy storage shed outside the eastern fence of the boatyard, and construction will begin soon. Additionally, the Committee seeks to increase the club fleet of off-the-beach dinghies, and has made a good start to this by successfully applying for a VicHealth grant to purchase a Hansa 303 dinghy for the Sailability program. The Committee is exploring more strategies (e.g. sponsorship, more grants) to grow the fleet.
- * The highest weakness and highest 'act now' issue arose from the fact that the club membership is comprised primarily of older members, and that there is an urgent need to attract young people and families into the club. As the dinghy fleet continues to grow, it is planned to conduct more Introduction to Sailing events, and to explore the possibility of approaching local schools to implement sailing programs into their curriculum. The Sailing and Motor Boat & Angling Subcommittees will also be making it a priority to devise strategies to attract and involve younger members. Membership involvement and volunteer participation was seen as a club strength; but it was also noted that many members wish to be more involved in the club and that the Committee could make better use of the expertise/occupation of club members.

NYS MEMBER COMPLETES ASSISTANT INSTRUCTOR COURSE AT ALBERT PARK LAKE

The following is a report from Gavin Russell about the course he completed in Melbourne. I thank Gavin for his report – and for his time and effort in undertaking this course. His learned knowledge and skills will be of great benefit to our club, and the Sailability program in particular.

"On Saturday June 11 I was fortunate to complete The Assistant Instructor course run by Australian Sailing Victoria at the "Boat Shed" on Albert Park Lake. With our Club's evolving commitment to our Sailability Program by using granted funds to acquire our first HANSA training dingy in the near future – it is important that we build a qualified group of volunteers / instructors to do the training.

After being accepted on the Assistant Instructor Course – my first job was to obtain some prerequisites: a

"Working With Children" check (free for volunteers); and the completion of an "Instructor General Principles" that I did on the "My Learning" internet site of Yachting Australia.

The Assistant Instructor Course was done over a full day and included both classroom learning and extensive outdoor skills demonstration activities.

Even though I have done a great deal of training over my working years, it is fair to say that I learned much. Children learning techniques, managing group behaviour, planning training activities, and safety were just a few of our topics.

After 3 hours in the classroom, it was time to put into practice and demonstrate our learnings (and be assessed). We did this by using dinghies on the lawn – and as we presented to the class members (who all acted as children), we had to keep control and train at the same time.

My two presentations were tacking a dingy and capsize recovery – and I am happy to tell you that I am now an expert on both!"

* It was recognised that the Committee needs to improve on communicating with members, and that succession planning is something to be addressed. The Committee had already become aware that communication between committees and members over the years has been inadequate, and had started to address this failing. The club website is currently being revamped, and will be launched in the near future. The new site will be more active and have information added and updated continuously - for example, the Committee intends to publish a report after every meeting. The inception of a club Facebook page is in progress, and this also will be instigated soon.

* Safety was regarded as being important; and training opportunities should continue to be provided.

As indicated, the Committee was taking action on some issues that arose before the planning for the future process began; and it has now become aware of other matters that require addressing. Consequently, the Committee is/will be

undertaking a number of projects now and into the future. To realise some of these projects the Committee will be seeking the support and involvement of members with specific areas of expertise. This may be done by requesting assistance from members generally, or by approaching specific members. Historically, much of what has been achieved at our club has come about due to the generous contribution of members in this way. When members are asked to contribute to their club in this manner, it is hoped that they accept the opportunity favourably.

Newhaven Yacht Squadron Year-round Fishing Competition Rules

The competition will start at 0800hrs on the day after Presentation Night (10 May 2015) and finish at 1500hrs on Presentation Night 2016. All fish sizes must comply with the Victorian Recreational Fishing Guide 2013 or as amended.

All fish must be free from mud, sand, sinkers or weights and must be weighed on the official squadron scales located in the lower deck. Fish must be weighed in the "as caught" condition except gummy sharks which must be bled and gutted.

The fishing area is unlimited, however fish must be weighed within 24 hours of being caught.

All fish weighed in must be recorded in the logbook and witnessed by another member of the Newhaven Yacht Squadron.

Entry is free.

There is no limit to the number of species of fish that the competitor may weigh-in. Please enter fish and weight as a record even if it is not the heaviest already weighed.

Prizes will be awarded for the heaviest fish for the year in the following

categories.

Only NYS Members and associates, Junior Members, or family members under 10 years are eligible to enter. Fish weighed in at other NYS competitions may also be entered.

To date we still have not been able to identify an offsite disposal area and are exploring if there are any possible alternatives on site.

If any member has experience in civil engineering or project management your help would be greatly appreciated.

A big thank you to Alen Garret, Garry Richards, Kon Cili, Tom Rawlings, George Reek, Michelle Lockwood, Tom Lainson, Jeff Shawcroft and Stan Jackson for safely moving all the boats.
