

This included working closely with members from Rhyll Yacht Club; we have developed a wonderful working relationship with our closest neighbours. Additionally we had input and support from Cowes Yacht Club. This hectic program also showed that NYS has the facilities and the personnel to run such a variety of events.

Well done everyone!

I hope members were able to appreciate the extra activity around our club and were able to get involved where they wanted. To members who had to change their plans to fit in with our visitors; thank you for your cooperation and support. We don't have plans to do the same next year but we are confident that we could run similar programs if requested. Members of the Sailing Sub-Committee would be pleased to get any feedback.

There are many facets to boating activities in our club. The traditional yacht racing and fishing competitions are areas that we concentrate on. This year we extended the number of boats eligible for trophies beyond those who entered the series. This was done, as we had an unusual occurrence; losing 5

regular competitors at the start of the season and gaining 3 competitors after the Series Entry had closed.

The Winter Series will start on 28th May. The winter series is very popular; less drama at the start and often thrilling finishes. This is achieved by having a pursuit start where it is calculated so that all boats will finish at the same time after 180 minutes of racing.

At the recent Sailing Sub-Committee meeting various ways of achieving this were discussed. It was decided to ensure the OOD finishes the race as close to the time limit as possible and the handicapper will provide a ready-reckoner to determine start times for shorter races. The handicap for the next race will be determined from the race times: the same as for the summer season. Don't let this complicated explanation put you off. Most sailors just enjoy the sail.

If you want to try out sailing then the winter races are a great opportunity. Come on the day and we should be able to place you on a yacht; better still contact the Rear Commodore and arrange a sail in advance.

I hope you enjoy the boating activities associated with NYS over the winter period. We often have many fine days that can be enjoyed. Other times it is best to dream and plan for warmer weather.



# Some important points when submitting items for the Quarterly

**Photos:** As a guide, the file size should be above 2 megabytes for a reasonable print. Anything less results in a tiny picture or a very grainy larger one.

Set your camera to take high resolution photos (more pixels), and when submitting a photo please include information about who or what is in the picture.

**Articles:** These should be in a Microsoft Word compatible format (.doc or .docx) or Rich Text Format (.rtf).

Acrobat (.pdf) is acceptable but bear in mind this format cannot be altered. Usually best for advertisement insertions.

# **Club Launching Ramp**

Only boats which are listed on the NYS register are permitted to be launched on the NYS ramp. Proof of this is that the boat must have displayed on the transom their allocated NYS number. The club maintains a register of boats together with proof of proper insurance to protect all our members. A club member may have as many boats registered as he or she likes but that member *must be present* with the boat when it is launched or retrieved. A breach of this rule will result in the immediate cancellation of access to the ramp. The tags which operate the chain *are not transferable to friends or family* and again a breach of this rule without a legitimate reason will also result in cancellation of access to the ramp. Be reminded that the committee has undertaken to maintain diligence on this issue for the protection of all members.

If you have recently added a boat on the register or have repainted your boat and need new numbers, many of our members use Clancy B J & Co. They can be found at 66 McBride Ave., Wonthaggi. The phone number is 56721867 and you don't even need to visit the store just ring them and they will post the numbers out to you.

# Sailability

URING FEBRUARY AND MARCH WE held six Sailability Sessions hosting Bass Coast Specialist School; South Gippsland Specialist School; Yooralla, Leongatha; Interchange, Wonthaggi; and SCOPE, San Remo. Over the six sessions we hosted thirty-nine participant and twenty-two carer involvements, and had great support from nineteen club members

The sessions comprised the visitors going out in yachts and motor boats, with the former tending to head north into the bay, and the latter initially heading for the Cleeland Bight vicinity to try to catch a prize from the sea – which they nearly always did. Colin Diggins built up a real reputation with the squid, missing out on a catch only once over the six outings. There was a rumour going around that Col went out the night before the sessions and planted them in his favourite spot! Actually, Col secretly hoped that no squid would be caught because he always ended up with ink all over himself.

After giving the fish a hiding, the motor boats tended to head north to join the yachts. There was great excitement one day when the occupants of three boats were treated to the playful antics of two seals swimming and frolicking exuberantly between two pylons under the bridge. During one very calm-weather session four or five boats were fortunate enough to be entertained by a seal near the top light. Having his peaceful slumber interrupted by this little flotilla, he decided to put on a show by playing in a clump of seaweed and waving his flipper. The visitors thought this was just fantastic!

Many of the participants have visited us a number of times now; and are becoming quite familiar with us - and vice versa. It is not only they who enjoy and glean benefit from the sessions. Increasingly, our club volunteers make comment about positive observations regarding individual participants; and it is easy to observe their own sense of fulfilment in helping to make those experiences and reactions possible. Personally, I found it very rewarding to observe one non-verbal autistic child who was behaving in a quite agitated manner in the clubhouse, sit peacefully and relaxed – with a huge smile on his face – the entire time on the boat.

Many thanks to all member volunteers who so enthusiastically assisted over these sessions- and who locked the session dates in their calendars immediately upon receiving notification of the dates. I would particularly like to acknowledge Tom and Jan Rawlings who brought their boat from Rhyll especially for all six sessions.

The next Sailability program will commence in the spring. If you are interested in assisting in any way, please let Alen Garrett or myself know.

Although the visitors enjoy our current Sailability program of being taken out in big boats, we are really looking forward to acquiring four Hansa dinghies and getting them really sailing. The virtually unsinkable Hansas are used in the true Sailability programs throughout Australia; and we have begun our quest to get four of these by submitting an application in the latest round of the VicHealth Active Club Grants program. We have applied for a grant of nearly \$10,000 to purchase one Hansa dinghy and its associated accessories. We will find out if we have been successful in May.

Also, we are in the process of gaining approval from Bass Coast Shire and relevant government agencies to build a shed in which to store the dinghies and their associated equipment. This shed will be located outside the eastern fence of the maintenance yard. We are confident of attaining approval shortly; and then work can begin.

We are keenly looking forward to acquiring the Hansa dinghies for use not only in our Sailability program, but also by members and prospective members during proposed Introduction to Sailing programs.

#### FIRST AID COURSE

We must admit that boating is a high risk pastime. We are all aware that, unfortunately, fatalities occur. But how aware are we of the injuries that happen when boating? I would dare say that all of us have hunted our boats for a bandaide at some stage. I wonder how many times this hunt was unsuccessful, and a hankie or towel was used as a last resort? And I wonder how many more serious injuries or illnesses have occurred on your boat – and how you (the skipper) have handled them. As skipper, you are responsible for the welfare of yourself and your crew. Therefore, knowledge of first aid is an essential component of any good skipper's repertoire. And of course, such a course will also be of benefit to you all day, every day, outside your boating life.

We will be conducting a First Aid Level 2 course on Sunday, August 7 (see details elsewhere in this magazine).

This course is designed to develop the knowledge and skills to provide first aid response; life support; and the management of casualties, the incident and other first aiders until the arrival of assistance. It covers CPR and basic emergency life support – including the use of the defibrillator – and the use of an Epipen for anaphylaxis. A minimum number of participants is required for this course to be conducted. The cost is \$120. But because the committee realises the value of this course to members, and of having people with first aid knowledge around the club and present at club activities, it has decided to pay \$50 of the cost. Therefore, the cost to you is only \$70.

#### **CLUB BOAT TRAINING SESSION**

Although it is expected that the Squadron boat will not be called upon as a rescue boat (rescue boats are now required to be in survey and skippered by Coxswains), it is available to assist members – and does carry out this role on occasions. It is also used during organised club events. Therefore, it is advantageous to have a small number of members competent in using it.

On Tuesday, February 9, Alen Garrett conducted a training day for a small group of members to instruct them in operating the club boat effectively and safely. The morning comprised a theory session covering, among others, such issues as safe operating procedures, correct use of marine radio, towing vessels, and generally how to monitor and assist off-the-beach dinghies. The practical session followed throughout the afternoon. The participants were taken through such matters as boat familiarisation, the starting routine, leaving the berth, anchoring, man over board, and berthing.

This was a very informative day – with the participants realising that operating the club boat is not a simple and insignificant task. We learnt that just keeping the club boat functional is a very responsible and, at times, a timeconsuming role. We all realise the time we spend on maintenance etc. with our own boats; similarly, the club boat requires time spent on it.

I would like to thank Alen for his comprehensive notes and expert practical instruction. And also, thanks to the volunteer participants not only for partaking in the day, but also for making themselves available to assist members and the club as the occasion may arise.

### NYS SAILABILITY VOLUNTEER INFORMATION **SESSION**

The number of member volunteers for our Sailability program continues to grow – and that's fantastic! Obviously, supporting people with impairments on a personal basis will be something new for most of our volunteers; and some have mentioned their lack of confidence in doing so. On Friday, February 19, we conducted a Sailability Volunteer Information session led by Dan Poynton, our GippSport and Access For All Abilities Coordinator. At the completion of the session all of the 13 participants commented on how useful it was in terms of strengthening their own confidence, and how they now better understood needs and desires of people with impairments. Thanks to Dan and all participants.

### Newhaven Yacht Squadron **Year-round Fishing Competition Rules**

The competition will start at 0800hrs on the day after Presentation Night (10 May 2015) and finish at 1500hrs on Presentation Night 2016. All fish sizes must comply with the Victorian Recreational Fishing Guide 2013 or as amended.

All fish must be free from mud, sand, sinkers or weights and must be weighed on the official squadron scales located in the lower deck. Fish must be weighed in the "as caught" condition except gummy sharks which must be bled and gutted.

The fishing area is unlimited, however fish must be weighed within 24 hours of being caught.

All fish weighed in must be recorded in the logbook and witnessed by another member of the Newhaven Yacht Squadron.

Entry is free.

There is no limit to the number of species of fish that the competitor may weigh-in. Please enter fish and weight as a record even if it is not the heaviest already weighed.

Prizes will be awarded for the heaviest fish for the year in the following

categories.

Only NYS Members and associates, Junior Members, or family members under 10 years are eligible to enter. Fish weighed in at other NYS competitions may also be entered.

It doesn't take much to become distracted. Luckily our full attention soon went to looking at where we were heading, as we both saw a kayak dead ahead, and only about 100 metres away. An incident was avoided but it gave us all a wake up call.

We've seen a gradual increase in the numbers of kayaks/canoes in Western Port over the last few years so it always pays to be vigilant. A flag on a stick like you sometimes see on motorised wheel chairs would certainly make these small craft more visible.

Later, when talking to Transport Safety Vic. they acknowledged the number of incidents involving kayaks and the need to be always, on the look out for other water users.

At night time be particularly observant as we hear of close encounters because of boats with no lights or inappropriate lights.

So, when you're on the water, always be vigilant and look out for other water users.
