SAILING AND BOATING

Alen Garrett, Marcus Bond and Ray Mascaro with the support of their volunteers have been busy with Sailability programs and youth programs for our club. We determined some time ago that we need to increase youth activity in our club, and we now have a **Junior membership category**. This is to make junior sailors and junior fishing girls and boys feel like they belong to the club. We hope that if we create a junior membership and junior programs that these young people will be our future leaders. We have our Hansa Dinghies which are excellent for both people with special needs as well as training boats, plus a fleet of dinghies for our young people to learn about and sail.

With our **Sailability program** we are conducting a young adult fishing day on **Tuesday 4th April**. We will have 12 participants plus their carers, **10am to 11.45am** and then another group **12.15 to 2.00 pm**. The idea has been popular in the past and we need at least 6 power boats to volunteer for the day plus helpers onshore. Participants will have a range of special needs; some may have difficulty with balance and may need to be seated. The idea is for these young people to experience power boats and perhaps a bit of fishing. This is a big day but very rewarding, so if possible, please set the day aside so that you can assist. It is fabulous to see the team of volunteers who support our Sailability program, they are to be commended for their enthusiasm for these programs.

Each month we welcome many new members, I am pleased to welcome the following new members to our club;


